Students are able to express their opinions, justifying their arguments and supporting them, using vocabulary and grammatical structures at the C1 Level of the Common Framework of References for Languages. Students are exposed to a variety of audios and videos, and are able to use their gist and detail listening skills to extract key information in order to complete paraphrased summaries of content.
